

Infectious Disease/COVID-19 Plan Campus Safety - Staff/Leaders/Volunteers Updated: March 2022

The Tabernacle is committed to the health and safety of our Tabernacle staff, leaders and volunteers. The infectious disease response plan outlined below addresses the current COVID-19 situation and are based on both local and state government recommendations for safely and responsibly managing the COVID-19 pandemic while working/serving at Tabernacle campuses. This plan may change based on new or updated guidelines.

- The COVID-19 safety guidelines below for working/serving at Tabernacle campuses will be communicated and available to all staff/leaders/volunteers.
- The safety guidelines pertain to all Tabernacle offices, facilities, worship areas and other Tabernacle properties.
- Masks are not required for staff/leaders/volunteers. However, disposable masks will be available for those who choose to wear one.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all Tabernacle offices/meeting areas/ worship spaces.
- The Tabernacle will not inquire regarding the vaccination status of staff/ leaders/volunteers.
- Responsibility for personal health should be exercised at all times. This includes staying home if you are ill, been exposed to COVID-19 or other infections illnesses, or have tested positive for COVID-19.

- Campus Pastors and Administrators will work together to manage campusspecific exposure/confirmed COVID-19 cases that may arise with leaders/ volunteers/congregants (Please see the COVID-19 Tabernacle Response plan for more details.)
- Tabernacle staff will be asked to follow the COVID-19 guidelines related to COVID-19 exposure/suspected illness/positive diagnosis. (*Please see the specific policy for more details.*)
- We encourage staff/leaders/volunteers to wash their hands or use hand sanitizer after using high-touch items such as shared computers, pens, phones, answering machines, copy machines, door/drawer handles and other office equipment. Hand sanitizer will be provided.
- Tabernacle staff/leaders/volunteers are expected to respect the personal space of others and refrain from behavior that may cause others to feel uncomfortable.
