

## Internet Usage Policy

Sept 2022

The Tabernacle provides staff/ministry leaders/coordinators and volunteers with access to the Internet. This access is given specifically encourage productivity and enhance church-related communication.

Correct use of the Internet will be expected at all times. Misuse or abuse of the Internet can affect productivity, potentially violate laws, ordinances or other Tabernacle policies, generate negative publicity for the church and potential expose it to significant legal liabilities.

The following Internet Usage Policy applies to all Tabernacle staff/ministry leaders/coordinators/volunteers who have access to the Internet while on all Tabernacle properties.

- Do not do anything with The Tabernacle Internet resource that would be considered illegal, grossly inappropriate, or offensive to the established value system set forth by The Tabernacle as a Christian, non-profit organization.
  Viewing or downloading erotica, playing games, and sending non-Tabernacle related mass mailings are examples.
- The Tabernacle reserves the right to view websites, information and downloads that have been viewed from church computers.
- All instances of Internet abuse/misuse should be reported to the Executive Director or Executive Pastor immediately.
- Misuse of the Internet or violations of the above policies will be addressed immediately and appropriate action will be taken. These actions can include, but are not limited to: loss of Internet privileges, disciplinary actions and, in extreme cases, criminal charges or termination.
