GROUND RULES

What's said in a group stays in the group. Vulnerability is necessary to build relationships that allow us to confess sin. That doesn't happen without a level of confidentiality. Another's confession is not dinner conversation.

Hold yourself and others accountable. As iron sharpens iron, one man sharpens another. We allow the Holy Spirit to be the Holy Spirit, but we hold each other accountable to pursue righteousness. To do this we must first examine ourselves.
