SCRIPTURE SUMMARY

In Revelation, the lamb pours out wrath on a sinful world that has rejected His grace.

As the 5th and 6th seals are opened, martyrs cry out to God for justice. Then, earthquakes, darkness and falling stars causing people to beg for death. The chapter ends asking, "who can stand?"

Live for Jesus like you will be killed for Jesus

Only Jesus can save you from the wrath of Jesus

SMALL GROUP NOTES

GROUND RULES

What's said in a group stays in the group.

Vulnerability is necessary to build relationships that allow us to confess sin. That doesn't happen without a level of confidentiality. Another's confession is not dinner conversation.

Hold yourself and others accountable.

As iron sharpens iron, one man sharpens another. We allow the Holy Spirit to be the Holy Spirit, but we hold each other accountable to pursue righteousness. To do this we must first examine ourselves.

Show Me.

We wrestle with the Word. Often we see things differently. We call these small rocks, but God's Word always has the final say.

- What does it look like to live the Christian life as if you will be killed for Jesus?
- Why does suffering and tribulation sometimes drive us away from God?
- How does God's coming wrath motivate you to live and share your faith?
