- Read Acts 3:19-26. What are all the benefits listed as a result of repentance and turning back to God?

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

- How does knowing that faith comes through Jesus affect how you deal with doubt, weakness, or pointing others to Him?

- What does repentance look like in your life, and how is it not just a one-time event, but a rhythm of your Christian life?

- What are some ways you can point people to Jesus in everyday conversations, without sounding forced or preachy?
