What does Saul's immediate obedience after encountering Jesus reveal about the transforming power of grace?
WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?
<ul> <li>Have you ever experienced grace that interrupted your path and set you on a new direction—just as it did for Saul?</li> </ul>
How does Ananias's obedience to show grace to Saul challenge how you show, or don't show, God's grace to others?
<ul> <li>How does this passage show that obedience to God often requires trusting Him more than our own understanding?</li> </ul>
