WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

- How does Philip's obedience to the Spirit challenge the way we respond to God's leading in our daily lives?

- Why do you think God orchestrated such a significant moment for just one man (the Ethiopian eunuch)? What does that say about how God views individuals?

- The Ethiopian eunuch was reading Scripture but needed help to understand it. What does this tell us about the importance of both personal Bible reading and community or guidance in understanding God's Word?

- What does this passage teach us about the "ends of the earth" part of Jesus' mission (Acts 1:8)? How are we participating in that mission today?

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

- Am I listening for and responding to the Holy Spirit like Philip did—even when it doesn't fully make sense?

- Who might be my "one" that God is calling me to reach—someone others might overlook, but God sees and values?

- Philip's mission ended with joy and transformation for someone else. How can I live in a way that helps others experience the joy of knowing Jesus?
