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- How do Aeneas's healing and Tabitha's resurrection demonstrate the gospel's power to bring new life—physically, spiritually, and communally?

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### WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

- Am I walking in the fear of the Lord and the comfort of the Holy Spirit—especially in times of difficulty or opposition?
  - Do I honor God with reverence in my daily choices?
  - Do I rely on the Holy Spirit for comfort, strength, and guidance?
  - Do I try to manage challenges with my own strength?

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- Does my life reflect the fruit, gifts, and boldness of someone spiritually healed and filled with the Spirit?

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- Am I content with the Giver (God), even when I don't receive the miracle or answer I prayed for?

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
