THE TABERNACLE SERMON NOTES

UNEXPECTED | THE UNEXPECTED PROMISE | LUKE 1:5-25; 67-80

In the quiet routines of an aged, forgotten couple, God breaks centuries of silence with an unexpected promise—one that moves forward despite Zechariah's doubt and turns his eventual restored voice into overflowing praise. Their story reminds us that even when God seems distant, His power is still present, His timing is perfect, and His redemptive plan always includes ordinary people who are ready to believe and fulfill their purpose.
