WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

What stands out to you about what the early believers “devoted themselves to” in Acts 2:42? What does their devotion reveal about what they believed was essential to following Jesus?

Acts 2 describes the believers gathering both in the temple and in their homes. Why do you think both large-group worship and smaller, relational community were important to their spiritual growth? What can one provide that the other cannot?

The passage is filled with action words—devoted, shared, gave, met, ate, praised. What is the difference between being a consumer of church and a participant in the body of Christ? Where do you see yourself on that spectrum?
